



On March 11th, we celebrated our 8th grade volleyball players! Congratulations on a great season and good luck as you move on to new adventures!



Tell us about yourself, how you became a Priest, and what you love about St. Mary's Church and School!

Greetings, I am Father Robert Zwilling, blessed to be the Pastor of St. Mary-Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Parish which includes St. Mary's School and St. Sebastian Parish. I am the youngest of 11 children. I grew up on a grain and livestock farm in the Olney area. My Dad asked me in 8th grade if I ever thought about being a priest. I said no, but because he asked, I started praying about it, going on youth retreats, talking to priests about it, and by age 19 I entered seminary training to become a Priest of Jesus Christ in 2005.

What I love about St. Mary's Church and School is that we can serve and love God 24 hours a day/7 days a week. Being able to pray, talk about, serve, and hear others talk about God is my joy! Here at St. Mary's Church every day we have prayer and worship.
