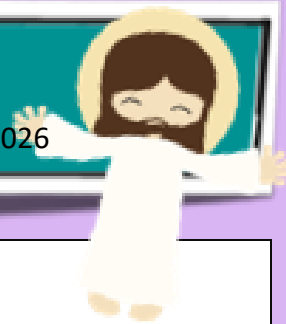

Religion: The Resurrection!


Phonics: Focus sound of /x/ as ending sound
